Term 3 Week 2, 26 July 2017

Dear Parents, Carers and Community Members,

Welcome to Term 3! I am going to call this term the 'term of movement' because your child will be moving a great deal throughout this period. This is most likely a good thing, because as we write this article it is pouring down with rain and the current temperature is sitting on about 13!

Aside from the Kindy students, all other year levels are currently participating in the Edu-Dance program. This dance program will run for 9 weeks this term, culminating in a dance spectacular on the evening of Thursday, 14 September and hosted by your P&C – more details about the concert evening will be forthcoming. The cost of the program is only \$14 per student as it has been heavily subsidised (to the tune of 50%) by the P&C. Thank you to the families who have already paid. Payment is due by Friday, 11 August.

Week Four, commencing Monday, 7 August, will be a very busy week for everyone. Firstly; it will be Winterfold's Book Week where students will be able to purchase books from the Scholastic Book display in the Library, before and after school on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday of that week. Also keep in the back of your mind that on Tuesday, 8 August, Winterfold will be holding its annual Book Character Dress Up Parade where everyone comes dressed as their favourite book character. Secondly; on Wednesday, 9 August, Mr Wotherspoon will be coordinating our Cross Country Carnival where students from Pre Primary to Year 6 will walk up to Dick Lawrence Reserve to participate in their category. Pre Primary to Year 2 will be running around a 600m course, Year 3 - 800m, Years 4/5 - 1000m, culminating in the Year 6's running 1600m. Lots of training is being conducted at school and we wish all participants well on the day. All first to third placegetters in Years 4 to 6 will be chosen to represent Winterfold in the Interschool Cross Country scheduled for Wednesday, 16 August. All parents are encouraged and are very welcome to spectate at both carnivals.

Now for a couple of housekeeping matters:

Because we have moved into the cooler months our lost property is overflowing with Winterfold jackets. If your child has lost a jacket please ensure you check in our lost property tub which can be found in the undercover area, next to the canteen and

uniform shop.

Dogs on leads are starting to creep back into the school. Dogs are NOT allowed on school property whilst there are students. Please - we want to avoid the unpleasant conversation requesting that you remove your dog!

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Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability

Background to the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

All Education Ministers from Commonwealth, state and territory governments have endorsed the implementation of a nationally consistent collection of data on school students with disability in all Australian schools (government, independent and Catholic).

The nationally consistent approach to data collection provides all Australian schools, education authorities and the community with a clear picture of the number of students receiving adjustments because of disability in schools, and the adjustments they are provided to enable them to participate in education on the same basis as other students.

Authority for the collection of information for the purposes of the NCCD

The *Australian Education Regulation 2013* (the Regulation) (<https://www.legislation.gov.au/Details/F2016C00958>) requires the operators of all government and non-government schools that receive Australian Government funding (approved authorities) to provide information to the Australian Government Department of Education and Training (the Department) for the purposes of the NCCD.

The information that approved authorities must give to the Department is set out at section 58A of the Regulation. This includes, in relation to each student with a disability at a school operated by the approved authority:

- the student's level of education (i.e. primary or secondary)
- the student's category of disability (i.e. physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional)
- the student's level of adjustment (i.e. support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive adjustment).

Other details about the information to be collected and the format in which the information is to be provided to the Department, are contained in guidelines approved by the Education Council (the committee of the Council of Australian Governments comprising the Commonwealth and state and territory Ministers responsible for education). The NCCD guidelines are available on the Department's website at www.education.gov.au/nationally-consistent-collection-data-students-disability-guidelines.

The information will not explicitly identify individual students (subsection 58A(3) of the Regulation); no information that could reasonably enable the Department to identify individual students will be provided by approved authorities to the department¹.
