Dear Parents, Carers and Community Members,

Term 4 has started with a rush – which is not uncommon for this time of year as we hit the busy term plus have to get all our planning for 2015 in place. Our staffing is taking shape and, as always, our IPS status provides us with good flexibility in this area. Under the new Student Centred Funding Model, enrolment numbers are even more critical than ever. Could I ask parents to advise the school as soon as possible if they are not returning in 2015. Similarly, if parents are aware of any potential enrolments, we would love to hear from them. We have vacancies at all year levels at present.

Art Exhibition

We will be holding our biennial Art Exhibition next Wednesday, 29 October, in our Under Cover Area from 5 -7pm – flyer accompanying this newsletter. Please note that, as the UCA will be licensed for this event, students **MUST** be accompanied by their parents, and **MUST** remain in the company of their parents at all times. Education Security will be present and any students not with their parents will be asked to leave the school grounds.

Dogs

A reminder that dogs are not permitted on school property – even on a leash. This is an Education Department Regulation. There have been a number of dogs sighted at school lately and we ask parents to refrain from bringing dogs to school.

Valuables at School


