Science Tabloid Day as written by Annabelle Geoghegan

Yesterday was Science Tabloid day. We begun the day by walking to the undercover area. I was very exited at that point. When we were all seated Mr Hodge came up and talked about how important science is. Then Mr Arkell came up and split everybody into groups. There were 7 senior groups and I was in the Mavericks.

The first place the Mavericks went to was Lemon Batteries with Mrs Sievenpiper. We had to split into groups, then we received 3 lemons. The lemons got cut in half, and then we used paper clips to stick them in the lemons and connect with crocodile clips. Then we connected the crocodile clips onto the tiny light bulb. My group only got a spark.

Our next activity was Car ramps with Ms Hill. We had to get into groups and create a ramp for a car. We had to estimate where our car would land. It also had to go the furthest out of all the cars. My group won and received a snake each!! It was lots of fun.



The Mavericks third activity was with Ms Brown and we were doing Brighter Bulbs. We got into groups and then elected the places. I was scribe in my group. Then the leaders had to go up and collect batteries and crocodile clips. In our groups we had to find out some way to make light from our bulb. My groups bulb didn't work at first, but then we got to get up and change our battery. With our new battery it worked!! The scribe had to write the changes between the two processes, then we used metal instead of two batteries and it worked too!!!

I enjoyed that activity very much and I was wondering if our next activity called Cool Colours with Ms Moloney. When we got to Ms Moloney's class she explained how to do it. When we were all ready, we split into groups and went to a desk. First we got our water dish and put a drop of food colouring in it. We had to observe what was happening to the water and the food colouring. After that we received an M&M each and had to bite it in half then draw a diagram of half of the M&M. We got to eat the other half! (A part I did not enjoy since I HATE chocolate) After that we got 4 coloured M&Ms and put them in the water dish to see what would happen. Then we drew a picture of what happened.

Right after Ms Malone's class it was recess and right after recess we all went back to the undercover area split back into groups.

The Mavericks next activity was Rockets with Mr Arkell. We got canisters, tablets and water. We poured water into the canisters, placed a quarter of the tablet in the water and timed how long it took to explode. That was really fun. The next thing we did was to make cannons (cardboard rolls with tape at the bottom). Then we put water in the canister and dropped the last 3 quarters of the tablet in the water. Once done we quickly closed the lid and placed the canister inside the cannon. Lots of cannons worked and went really far.

Finally it was the last activity of the day – Rotocopters with Ms Coppin. First we got a balloon and drew lines on it to mark where the sticky tape will go. Then we had to fold back tape and stick it on the lines on an angle, and finally we stuck a cup at the bottom. After we made our Rotocopters we got hair dryers and tried to blow our rotocopters into a cup. That was very enjoyable.

After that it was lunch and I was getting impatient waiting for the Scitech show. Finally, the bell rang for the end of lunch. Everyone came to the undercover area and sat down ready for the Scitech Show. Mr Berry announced the winners who were the best during the day and they received a Scitech one person pass. Then the show started. A lady came on stage with a giant bottle of liquid nitrogen. Rima came up and blew a balloon on stage, while the lady blew one up with nitrogen and when it popped it made a HUMONGOUS noise!!!



She used a "doingy" tester to test noises (it was really a frying pan) and then dipped the thing she used into nitrogen and banged it on the "doingy" tester, making a louder noise then the first bang. 

Well done to all of those involved.


P&C Canteen News
